MONTHLY REPORT AUGUST 2012

SKATEBOARDING VIOLATION

On August 1st, an officer was dispatched to the downtown pavilion on a skateboarding complaint. The officer learned the eighteen year old skateboarder had been warned by officers on two other occasions regarding the city ordinance. The officer issued the skateboarder a violation and released same.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On August 1st, an officer patrolling the city park located a sixty-two year old homeless man sleeping on a park bench. The man was a missing endangered person out of Detroit. Officers detained the man and transported same to the Detroit Police Department in the morning to be turned over to relatives.

DISTURBANCE

On August 2nd, officers were dispatched to the downtown US Post Office for a report of anti-Obama protesters. Upon arrival the protesters were advised to move off the private property and onto the public sidewalk. Officers received no further problems from the protesters.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 3rd, at approximately 10:35 p.m., a sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle that had been speeding in the area of Grand River and Brookdale. Further investigation revealed that the driver had been consuming intoxicants at the Grand Tavern in Farmington Hills. The man failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The man consented to a Datamaster breath test with results of a .16 BAC. The man was housed at the Farmington jail.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 4th, an officer monitoring Farmington Hills Police Department traffic heard a "BOL" regarding two vehicles drag racing westbound Eight Mile from Merriman. The officer positioned himself in the Valero parking lot at Eight Mile and Farmington Road. The officer observed a vehicle matching the "BOL" description traveling at a high rate of speed westbound on Eight Mile near Farmington Road. The officer estimated the speed at over 60 mph in a 45 mph zone. A traffic stop was conducted. The driver admitted to being in a drag race with another vehicle. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to consuming some shots of Crown Royal whiskey earlier in the evening at a Karaoke bar. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT

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of .14(9). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .15. The driver was issued a citation for OWI and housed until sober.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On August 4th, at 11:04 a.m., an officer responded to the lot of Farmington Place Apartments for a Larceny From Auto complaint. Upon investigating it was learned that there was nothing stolen from the vehicle and it is not likely that anybody even entered the vehicle. There are no suspects in the matter and there was no evidence to process.

CUSTOMER TROUBLE/MISDEMEANOR WARRANT

On August 4th, at 12:10 p.m., officers responded to TCF Bank for customer trouble that was reported by a bank customer. Upon arrival the customer trouble was resolved but while investigating involved parties, it was learned that one of them had a criminal bench warrant out of Wayne County. The man was arrested on the warrant and turned over to Wayne County.

FAMILY TROUBLE

On August 4th, at approximately 7:12 p.m., a woman came into this police department to report that her estranged husband had shown up to her work threatening to harm her new boyfriend should the two continue dating. The woman was provided with Personal Protection Order Information and advised to report the incident to the City of Redford where she lives.

MINOR IN POSSESSION

On August 5th, an officer was dispatched to the area of Grand River and Power on a noise complaint. Upon arrival, the officer located two intoxicated subjects. The subjects were under the age of 21. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants on the subjects. A PBT was offered with one subject agreeing to provide a sample with a result of .07(7). The other subject was asleep in a vehicle and needed medical attention for alcohol poisoning. CEMS was contacted and subsequently transported the subject to Botsford Hospital. The officer issued Minor in Possession citations to both subjects.

UNLAWFUL DRIVING AWAY OF AUTOMOBILE

On August 5th, an officer was dispatched to Drakeshire Apartments on a report of a stolen vehicle. The reporting party reported her 2009 Nissan stolen. The vehicle was entered into LEIN and a report completed.

NOISE COMPLAINT/MINOR IN POSSESSION/PROBATION VIOLATION

On August 5th, at 9:47 a.m., officers responded to a noise complaint at 32580 Grand River after the midnight shift had already been there earlier in the morning and issued Minor In Possession (MIP) of alcohol tickets to two teens. Upon arrival all was quiet, but there was now a third teen who was also intoxicated. The teen was issued a citation for MIP and a copy of the report will be forwarded to his probation officer in Clare County as 'no alcohol' was a condition of his probation.

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JUVENILE RUNAWAY

On August 6th an officer observed a young male near the gazebo at the Village Commons at approximately 1:00 a.m. The sixteen year old subject provided his name but could not recall where he lived. After further investigation, the officer learned he had runaway from his residence in Detroit. The officer contacted the subject's mother who picked up same at the station.

FALSE IDENTIFICATION/MINOR IN POSSESSION

On August 6th officers were dispatched to Drakeshire Apartments on a report of a fight between a male and two females outside the complex. Upon arrival, officers checked the area and located a male sitting on a curb in close proximity to the scene of the incident. The subject denied any involvement in the incident. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants on the subject. The subject provided two different names to the officer and a date of birth indicating he was twenty years old. The subject agreed to submit to a PBT with a result of .11(5). The subject's identity was never confirmed. The officer arrested the subject on charges of False Identification and Minor in Possession. The subject was fingerprinted to establish his identity. The subject had two outstanding warrants out of this department under his legal name. The officers searched the area and found no other subjects or evidence of a fight.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On August 6th a resident of the Farmington Plaza Apartments came into the station to file a Malicious Destruction of Property report in reference to damage she has noticed on her vehicle between June 2012 and August 2012. The resident stated she has noticed "key" marks along with "erosion" damage possibly caused by a caustic substance. The resident has no specific suspect(s) in mind, but has had problems in the past with a co-worker in Livonia along with some juveniles at the apartment complex.

WARRANT ARREST OTHER AGENCY

On August 6th a subject came into the station to turn himself in on an outstanding Friend of the Court warrant out of Oakland County for back child support. Warrant was confirmed with Oakland County and the subject was arrested and held for Oakland County Friend of the Court unit.

NEVER ACQUIRED LICENSE

On August 6th an officer on patrol ran a check on a vehicle traveling on M-5 near Farmington Road, which came back with the license plate showing that it was not a valid plate and had been replaced. Upon making a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was found that the driver had never had a valid driver's license. The driver was arrested for Never Acquired License.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 7th an officer observed a vehicle not stop exiting a private drive near Grand River and Power. A traffic stop was conducted. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming a shot of Crown

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Royal. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .17(2). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was turned over to the passenger. The driver agreed to submit to a breath test with a result of .18/.18. The officer issued a citation for OWI and the driver was housed until sober.

EMBEZZLEMENT

On August 7th the owner of Courtland Associates came into this police department to advise that sometime over the weekend (August 3rd to August 6th), five of his employees packed up and left. The employees stole thousands of dollars of office supplies and took several of the customer files with them. It was later revealed that one of the employees had started his own business and is apparently attempting to put Courtland out of business.

GRASS FIRE

On August 7th, at 2:11 p.m., officers along with Engine 3 responded to the area of west M-5 and Farmington Road for a report of a grass fire. Upon arrival there was approximately one hundred yards of the side of the roadway on fire. The fire was extinguished by responding personnel. It is unknown how the fire began.

SOLICITING WITHOUT A PERMIT

On August 8th officers were dispatched to the area of Flanders and Laurelwood Street on a report of four males soliciting for handyman work. Officers checked the area and located the four males who were handing out flyers door to door for home improvement services. All four males were advised of the City of Farmington ordinance regarding distribution of handbills on doors in the city. Two of the four males had warrants out of other agencies for traffic related offenses and were arrested.

ASSIST OTHER AGENCY

On August 8th this department assisted Farmington Hills Police Department with the housing of their prisoners due to problems with their lock-up.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING

On August 10th officers were dispatched to Kitchen Creations on a report of a larceny of a wallet that had occurred there. Upon arrival, the owner of the wallet stated she had placed her wallet on a shelf at the rear of the store while she carried a box to the front of the store. When she returned to get her wallet, it was gone. Only one other customer was in the store at the time, but was gone upon arrival.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 11th an officer observed a vehicle with an improperly displayed plate in the rear window. A traffic stop was conducted on Nine Mile east of Farmington Road. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming alcoholic beverages at his residence in Redford. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .12(7). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle impounded. The driver agreed to submit to a breath

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test with a result of .14 and .15. The officer issued a citation for OWI and the driver was housed until sober.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS

On August 13th, at approximately 8:16 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a white Ford Ranger in the area of Grand River and Power Road for having two burned out brake lights. Further investigation revealed that the driver has five (5) suspensions on his driving record and two (2) warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested and housed at the Farmington jail.

CIVIL WARRANT OTHER JURISDICTION

On August 14th, at approximately 5:28 p.m., an officer stopped a green Mercury Mountaineer on Drake Road for speeding. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a Friend of the Court warrant for child support out of Wayne County. The warrant was confirmed by Wayne County. The man was arrested and housed at the Farmington jail.

SUSPICIOUS DAMAGE

On August 14th, at approximately 7:36 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 20000 block of Robinwood Street for a report of a possible attempt home invasion. Upon arrival the officers learned from the homeowner that he had just noticed possible pry marks near the lock on his rear door. Officers checked the damage and noted that the marks did appear to be pry marks, but that the lock and door were not compromised. The complainant advised that his son had been home all day except between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. No entry was made into the home and the homeowner has no suspects.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA PARAPHERNALIA

On August 14th, at approximately 10:57 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a Pontiac G6 for not using a turn signal when turning at Warner and Grand River Avenue. Upon approaching the five (5) occupants of the vehicle, the officer detected a moderate odor of marijuana emanating from inside the vehicle. The officer confronted the occupants who admitted that they had been smoking marijuana at a party and that there would be marijuana and paraphernalia inside the vehicle. A search of the vehicle was conducted which produced two (2) marijuana pipes, a marijuana crusher, and an empty zip lock bag that had a strong odor of marijuana inside. Further investigation revealed that one of the occupants had eaten the marijuana from the zip lock bag as the vehicle was being pulled over by the officer. Two of the occupants of the vehicle were cited for being in possession of the paraphernalia.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 15th, at 3:38 a.m., a midnight officer was conducting stationary radar in the parking lot of the Farmington High School. The officer noticed a speeding vehicle and measured the speed of the vehicle to be 53 mph in a posted 25 mph zone. The officer stopped the vehicle for the violation on Orchard Lake Road near Shiawassee. The officer made contact with the driver and noted an odor of intoxicants on his breath. The

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officer had the driver step from the vehicle to perform some sobriety evaluations. The driver failed the evaluations and was given a PBT with a result of .13(0). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and for Driving While License Suspended. The driver was transported to the Farmington police station where he given a Datamaster, which confirmed the level of intoxication. The driver had previously admitted to consuming "two cups of beer, at his brother's home." The driver was lodged in the Farmington jail until sober and he posted bond.

LARCENY FROM VEHICLES

On August 15th the dayshift took sixteen reports of vehicles that had been entered and property stolen within the Chatham Hills Subdivision. The vehicles were all unlocked and had been entered during the night. A suspect has been arrested for the thefts.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On August 15th, at approximately 10:29 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a Buick on the M-5 expressway for driving over the fog line and a vision obstruction. A subsequent investigation revealed that the woman has a traffic warrant out for her arrest out of the City of Ferndale. The woman was arrested on the warrant and house at the Farmington jail pending pick up from Ferndale police.

MINOR HAVING CONSUMED INTOXICANTS

On August 16th, at approximately 11:32 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a party bus in the area of Grand River and Shiawassee for a commercial vehicle violation. Further investigation revealed three minors on the bus who had been consuming alcohol. The three minors were cited for the violations.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 17th, 2:41 a.m., a midnight shift officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Grand River at Whittaker, 60 mph in a 45 mph zone. Prior to stopping the vehicle, it ran the red light at Grand River and Drake Road. The officer made contact with the driver who informed the officer that she had just finished her shift and was trying to get home to Birmingham, but she was lost. The driver stated that she had consumed two "Red Bulls and Vodka" at work, but her boss had given her a breathalyzer before letting her leave, and he said she was "Okay to drive." The driver was given sobriety evaluations which she failed. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and transported to the station and given a Datamaster. The driver had a BAC of .10. The driver was lodged in the Farmington jail until sober and she posted bond.

MINOR IN POSSESSION

As part of a subject's probation, he must submit to daily PBT's at the Farmington Police Department. On August 17th, at 6:45 a.m., this subject came into the police department and submitted to the PBT. The subject had a BAC of .04(2). The subject was cited for Minor in Possession and his probation officer was advised of the results.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 18th, at 4:36 a.m., a midnight officer heard a BOL from Farmington Hills

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about a vehicle traveling the wrong way on M5. The officer entered eastbound M5 from Nine Mile and observed a vehicle traveling eastbound M5 in the westbound lane. The officer paralleled the vehicle and was able to stop the vehicle on Grand River at Colgate. The officer made contact with the driver and noted that the driver had an odor of intoxicants on his breath. When asked about driving on the wrong side of the expressway, he stated "I didn't know where I was, I never come this way." The driver was given sobriety evaluations, which he failed. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and transported to the station. At the station, the officer administered the Datamaster with a result of .14. The driver was lodged in the Farmington jail until sober and he posted bond. The driver was also cited for Driving While License Suspended.

MENTAL

On August 19th, at 12:27 a.m., midnight shift officers were dispatched to a local apartment complex on a report of breaking glass and yelling. Upon arrival, multiple tenants were outside looking for the source of the commotion. After some searching, a broken door wall window was located on a second floor apartment. Officers made contact with the occupant. When the occupant opened the door for officers, officers could see into his apartment. The apartment had been completely destroyed. The officers took the subject into protective custody and interviewed him. It was learned that the subject has not been taking his anti-psychotic medication and believed bugs were in his walls. The subject used a hammer to knock down all of the walls in the apartment and destroy all of his possessions. Management was contacted to turn the power off to the apartment because electrical wires were exposed. A board up company was also contacted to secure the broken door wall and windows. The subject was transported to Botsford Hospital for a mental commitment.

CARRYING A CONCEALED WEAPON-GUN

On August 19th, at 2:12 a.m., midnight shift officers were dispatched to the pool of a local apartment building on a report of people swimming after hours and making noise. Officers made the scene and contacted two females swimming and two males standing by the fence. The females fled the area and the officers contacted the males. The subjects were patted down and an officer felt a gun in a pocket of a back pack. When the back pack was searched, a small unloaded revolver was found. The subject (eighteen year old male) who owned the back pack was arrested for Carrying a Concealed Weapon and Possession of an Unregistered Handgun. The subject later stated that he had found the gun in Drake Park and wanted to turn it in, but he decided to keep the gun for protection.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING

On August 20th, a patron at the Basement Burger Bar located at 33316 Grand River reported unknown suspect(s) stole his cell phone from his table between midnight and 2:00 a.m. No suspect information was available.

UTILITY POLE FIRE

On August 20th, at approximately 4:13 p.m., officers responded to Health Quest on

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Drake Road for a report of an electrical pole on fire. Upon arrival with Engine 3, officers noted that the base of the pole had a small pile of dried rubbish that appeared to have been accidentally set on fire, possibly by a cigarette. Officers noted that the fire was only smoldering at this time. The smoldering pile was extinguished.

FIRE ALARM

On August 20th, at approximately 5:39 p.m., Engine 3 responded to the Rainbow Rehabilitation Center on Gill Road for a report of a fire alarm. Upon arrival officers learned that the alarm was activated by steam from a hot faucet and that there was no fire on the scene.

FELONY WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On August 21st, an officer stopped a vehicle with an expired license plate. The officer received identification from both the driver and passenger. The passenger had an outstanding Felony Warrant out of the attorney general's office for Fraud (no bond). The warrant was confirmed with Detroit Police Department who requested a hold on the passenger. The passenger was arrested and housed by this police department and subsequently turned over to the Detroit Police Department. The driver was issued a citation for expired plates.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 21st, at 2:40 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for traveling 50 mph in a 35 mph zone at Grand River and Power. The driver had a suspended driver's license and was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the station where she was processed and released with a violation for Driving While License Suspended and speeding.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT

On August 21st, at approximately 4:55 p.m., a man driving west on Grand River Avenue near Orchard Lake Road was rear ended by a white Ford Ranger. The suspect vehicle then left the scene of the accident by heading north on Lilac Street from Grand River Avenue. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate the Ford Ranger.

LARCENY OF RAT BAIT BOX

The city's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for 2012 is projected by Oakland County to be \$24,418. As part of the application process, the city must hold a public hearing. Our completed application, accompanied by a resolution of Council approval, must be submitted to Oakland County by late November 2012.

As Council knows, CDBG funding eligibility is restricted to projects or programs that meet specific objectives determined by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Of these objectives, Farmington is limited to CDBG funding for projects where "the primary beneficiaries are low or moderate income people."

Council may recall from previous years' CDBG applications that senior programs/projects receive special eligibility consideration. The administration's preliminary recommendation, outlined below, proposes a CDBG program that is not administratively burdensome, and continues current city funding level for the senior center and senior services.

CDBG funds are federal funds administered by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The administration's preliminary recommendation is that Council considers establishing the following development objectives: (1) senior center and (2) public services (senior services). The administration proposes allocating \$20,798 for senior center and \$3,620 for public services (senior services).

Description: Consideration to Approve Estimate #2 and Change Order #1 for Farmington Road Concrete Patching and Sidewalk Improvements

Requested Action:

Move to approve construction estimate #2 with Hard Rock Concrete Inc for the project work in the amount of \$45,804.85 and approve change order #1 reducing the contract amount by \$33,911.14.

Background:

At the March 19, 2012 meeting, the Farmington City Council awarded the Farmington Road Concrete Patching and Sidewalk Improvements program contract to Hard Rock Concrete Inc. in the amount of \$179,107.50. Enclosed is construction estimate #2 in the amount of \$45,804.85. This represents substantial completion of the project. The only remaining work is the installation of some signs and release of the total retainage.

Change Order #1 is a balancing change order in which the quantities estimated in the original contract were less than what was necessary. This reduced the contact amount by \$33,911.14. It is anticipated that the final construction estimate to close out the project will be presented at the October meeting.
