Motion made by Cavanaugh and supported by Miller that the PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE C-23-48, KNOWN AS "TRAFFIC ORDINANCE", TO PROVIDE FOR THE INSTALLATION, REGULATION AND CONTROL OF THE USE OF PARKING METERS AND PARKING METER ZONES: DEFINING PARKING METER ZONES: AUTHORIZING A METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR PARKING METERS AND THE INSTALLATION THEREOF EXCLUSIVELY FROM RECEIPTS OBTAINED FROM THE OPERATION: PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND PROVIDING THAT INVALIDITY OF PART SHALL NOT AFFECT THE VALIDITY OF REMAINDER AS FOLLOWS: BE INTRODUCED:

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

That Ordinance No. C-23-48 be and the same is hereby amended, in accordance with the above subject matter by the addition of a new article thereto to be known as Article XVIII to read as follows:-

SECTION 89. VEHICLE. Every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a street or highway.

SECTION 90. The following described streets in the City of Farmington are hereby designated and established as parking meter zones, to-wit: All those streets and parts of streets upon which limited parking is now and/or may hereafter be permitted under authority and by virtue of all limited parking ordinances now and/or hereafter effective, and the parking limits and restrictions now and/or hereinafter therein provided are hereby incorporated and in this article for all uses and purposes applicable to the conditions, terms, and enforcement hereof.

The number of parking meters to be installed and the locations thereof shall be selected by the City Manager by and with the advice of the Chief of Police.

SECTION 91. The City Manager shall provide for installation of meters, including curb or street marking lines, regulation and operation thereof, and shall cause said meters to be maintained in good workable condition. Meters shall be placed upon the curb next to individual parking places and meters shall be so constructed as to display a signal showing legal parking upon deposit therein of the proper coin, or coins, of the United States as indicated by instructions on said meter, and for a period of time conforming to the parking limits of the City of Farmington, said signal to remain in evidence until expiration of said parking period so designated, at which time a change of signal or some other mechanical operation shall indicate expiration of said parking period.

SECTION 92. The City is hereby vested with the authority to enter into a contract for the purchase and installation of parking meters and to provide payment therefor exclusively from the receipts obtained by the City from their operation and that said means of payment shall be in addition to any other purchasing powers heretofore granted the City by its charter, or by the laws of the State of Michigan.

SECTION 93. When any vehicle shall be parked next to a parking meter the owner or operator of said vehicle shall park within the area designated by the curb or street marking lines as indicated for parallel or diagonal parking and upon entering said parking space shall immediately deposit in said meter one or more five cent coins of the United States, and/or one or more one cent coins of the United States as indicated by instructions on said meter. It shall be unlawful for any person to fail to park within said designated area, or fail or neglect to so deposit the proper coin, or coins.

Said parking space may then be used by such vehicle during the legal parking limit provided by the ordinances of the City, and said vehicle shall be considered as unlawfully parked if it remains in said space beyond the legal parking limit and/or when said parking meter displays a signal showing such illegal parking.

It shall be unlawful for any person to cause or permit any vehicle registered in his name to be unlawfully parked as set out in this section.

SECTION 94. It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit, or cause to be deposited in a parking meter one or more five cent coins and/or one or more one cent coins for the purpose of extending the parking time beyond the maximum time fixed by the ordinance of the City of Farmington.

SECTION 95. It shall be unlawful to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug, device or a metallic substitute for a coin of the United States.

SECTION 96. It shall be unlawful for any person to tamper with, open, wilfully break or destroy any parking meter.

SECTION 97. CITATION TAGS. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized and directed to supply police officers with citation tags for the purpose of giving notice to persons violating any provisions of this ordinance. Such notice may be given by delivering such tag to the violator or by affixing it to the vehicle by means of which the violation occurred. Such citation tag shall direct the violator to appear and to present such tag at a designated place on or before a date and hour specified thereon. Nothing in this section shall be construed to abridge the

power of a police officer to arrest any violator and take him into custody.

SECTION 98. PROCEDURE FOR TAGGING VEHICLES: Whenever any motor vehicle without a driver is found parked or stopped in violation of any of the restrictions imposed by this ordinance, the officer finding such vehicle shall take its registration number and may take any other information displayed on the vehicle which may identify its user, and shall conspicuously affix to such vehicle a notice in writing on a form provided by the City for the driver to answer to the charge against him within seven (7) days at the time and place specified in the notice. The officer shall deliver copies of such notice to the Traffic Violations Bureau.

SECTION 99. All provisions of Article XIV of said Ordinance No. C-23-48 are hereby declared to be part of and shall be construed as applicable to this article hereby added to said "Traffic Ordinance". It shall be the duty of all police officers and they are hereby authorized and empowered, in the enforcement of this article, to comply with all provisions and procedure contained in Article XIV of said ordinance, and in the article herein enacted.

SECTION 100. PROCEDURE FOR IMPOUNDMENT OF VEHICLE. Any police officer may impound any motor vehicle parked at a place where parking is prohibited by this ordinance, or which has been parked for more than one hour in excess of the time allowed for parking in any place, or which has been involved in two or more violations of this ordinance, for which citation tags have been issued and not presented as required herein. Any person desiring to redeem such impounded vehicle shall first pay such fine or fines as may be assessed by the Judge of the Municipal Court for the violation or violations for which such motor vehicle was impounded, PROVIDED that such fine or fines shall not exceed Five (\$5.00) Dollars and Five (\$5.00) Dollars costs for each such offense.

SECTION 101. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate or permit or allow any one to violate SECTION 93 or SECTION 94 of Article XVIII of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction be fined not more than Two (\$2.00) dollars.

SECTION 102. Any person who shall violate or assist in the violation of Section 95 of Article XVIII of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not more than fifteen days (15) or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 103. Any person who shall violate or assist in the violation of Section 96 of Article XVIII of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not more than ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 104. The fee required to be deposited in said meter is hereby levied as a police regulation and inspection fee to cover the cost of providing parking spaces, parking meters and installations, and maintenance thereof, the cost of regularion and inspection, operation, control and use of the parking meter spaces and zones created herein, for the regulation and control of traffic moving in and out of, and parking in, said parking spaces and zones so created, and for the cost of any resultant traffic administration expense.

SECTION 105. If any section, provision or part of this article shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, then such adjudication shall not effect the validity of the article as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not so adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 106. This amendment shall take effect November 19th, A. D. 1951.

Section 10 On the north side of Grand River Avenue between Oakland Avenue and the westerly line of the City Limits.

Section 11 On the south side of Grand River Avenue between Liberty Street and the westerly line of the City Limits.

Motion made by Cavanaugh and supported by Nourjian that AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. C-23-48 KNOWN AS TRAFFIC ORDINANCE BY ADDING A NEW SCHEDULE THEREIN RELATING TO LEFT TURNS be introduced as follows:

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

1. That Ordinance No. C-23-48 be and the same is hereby amended by the addition of a new schedule thereto, to read as follows:-

SCHEDULE XI

NO LEFT TURNS AT ANY TIME IN THE FOLLOWING DESIGNATED AREAS:-

1. No vehicle shall make a left hand turn off Grand River for the purpose of entering the driveway between Grand River Street numbers 33245 and 33305.
2. No vehicle entering into Grand River from the driveway between Grand River street numbers 33245 and 33305 shall make a left hand turn upon entering into Grand River Avenue.
3. That Schedule X of Ordinance No. C-23-48, "AMOUNT TO BE PAID VIOLATION BUREAU IN LIEU OF COURT ACTION" be and the same is hereby revised by the addition of a new provision to read as follows:-

"MAKING A PROHIBITED LEFT TURN \$3.00

4. This amendment to Ordinance No. C-23-48 by addition of Schedule XI thereto and the addition to Schedule X thereof shall become effective November 19, 1951.

RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Farmington that Schedule VII of Ordinance No. C-23-48 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

No "U" Turn on Grand River Avenue (U.S. 16)
within the City Limits.

Motion lost for lack of support.

Motion made by Miller and supported by Conroy to introduce Ordinance C-26-51 relating to the construction, rebuilding and repair of sidewalks and cross-walks, in the City of Farmington, as follows:

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:-

1. That the owner or owners of real property within the City shall construct, rebuild, repair and maintain sidewalks, adjacent to and abutting upon the property of such owner or owners.

2. Sidewalks shall be built, rebuilt, repaired and maintained under the supervision of the City Manager, or such other official or employee as the Council may by resolution appoint, and such person is hereby authorized to determine the grade and material specifications of all sidewalks to be built, rebuilt and/or repaired and is also authorized to give all notices required to be given by any section or provision of this ordinance to the owners and/or occupants of any real property within the City.
3. Whenever sidewalks are ordered on any street or parts of streets where none have heretofore existed, it shall be the duty of the City Manager or other official or employee appointed by the Council to establish a sidewalk line on said street or part of street, said stakes to designate the outer edge of the sidewalk from the lot.
4. The City Manager or other official or employee appointed by the City shall keep a record of all sidewalk lines and grades in a book prepared for that purpose which record shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.
5. The Council may at any time, by resolution, authorize, direct, and/or require that sidewalks shall be constructed, rebuilt or repaired along either or both sides of any street or streets or any part of any street or streets.
6. Such resolution shall specify the points of terminus and width of any sidewalk to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired.
7. Within five (5) days after the passage of such resolution the person appointed under the provisions of Sec. 2 hereof shall give written notice by first class mail to the owner or owners of the lot or premises, as shown by the current tax roll of the City, in front of, or adjacent to and abutting which the sidewalk is to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired, requiring such person or persons to construct, rebuild, or repair said sidewalk or such portion thereof as may be ordered adjacent to and abutting the several parcels of land so owned within 30 days from date of such notice. Such notice shall also contain a statement of the established grade of such sidewalk and the material specifications to be used.
8. If the owner, owners or agent of any lot or premises shall refuse or neglect to build, rebuild or repair any sidewalk, in the manner and within the time prescribed by the council, the City Manager or other official or employee appointed by the Council is hereby authorized and directed, as soon as may be convenient after the expiration of said time, to cause said sidewalk and/or sidewalks or parts of sidewalks to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired, and the expense and cost of so doing shall be assessed to the person or persons so refusing or neglecting as aforesaid and the same shall be charged and assessed such lot and/or premises.
9. It shall be the duty of the City Manager to make a complete and full report to the Council, when any such sidewalk shall have been constructed, rebuilt or repaired by him or under his direction and/or on behalf of the City, of the cost and expense of such construction, rebuilding or repairing and the proportionate cost and expense to be charged to each lot or premises.
10. The Council shall by resolution appoint a time at which it will make assessment and/or assessments for the construction, rebuilding and/or repair of any sidewalk or sidewalks or parts of any sidewalks and shall cause notice of the time it will act thereon to be given by first class mail to the owner and/or owners of all property to be assessed as shown by current tax roll of the City, such notice to be posted at least 10 days prior to the time appointed for such hearing.
11. At the time appointed for acting on the assessments above set forth, or at such subsequent time to which such action may be adjourned, the Council shall proceed by resolution to assess the lot, lots and/or premises adjacent to and abutting which any sidewalk shall have been constructed, rebuilt and/or repaired with the proper cost and expense thereof and the adoption of such resolution shall be the

equivalent of, constitute and be construed as a confirmation of a special assessment roll.

12. Upon confirmation of such special assessment roll in the manner above set forth, the special assessments shall become a debt due the City from the persons to whom they are assessed to be due and payable at such time as the Council, by resolution prescribe and shall until paid, be a lien upon the property assessed for that amount of such assessment and all interest and charges thereon, and the Council shall order the assessor to spread the amount thereof upon the special assessment roll as a special assessment upon such lot or premises. Such lien shall be of the same character and effect as provided by the Charter of the City for City Taxes and shall be collected in the same manner as other City taxes.
13. The City may collect the amount of any sidewalk assessment together with all interest, charges and fees due thereon, plus cost of suit in an action of assumpsit.
14. All cross-walks shall be constructed and kept in repair by the City under the direction of the City Manager.
15. Failure to mail any notice required to be sent by this ordinance shall not invalidate any assessment made hereunder or any assessment roll hereunder.
16. If any provisions, section, clause or phrase or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be found to be invalid by any court, such invalidity shall not affect any remaining portion or application of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application, provided such remaining portions or applications are not determined by the Court to be inoperable and to this end, this ordinance is hereby declared to be severable.
17. This ordinance shall become effective December 14th, 1951.

Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Miller and supported by Conroy to introduce Ordinance C-27-51 relating to the cleaning of sidewalks in the City of Farmington as follows:

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

1. That every owner and/or owners of real property within the City shall at all times keep all sidewalks adjacent to and abutting their property free and clear from snow, ice, filth and other obstructions.
2. That every tenant, lessee and/or occupant of real property within the City shall at all times keep the sidewalks adjacent to and abutting the property of which he is a tenant, lessee and/or occupant free and clear of all snow, ice, filth and other obstructions.
3. If any owner, tenant, lessee and/or occupant of any real property within the City shall refuse or neglect to keep any sidewalk in front of, adjacent to and/or abutting any property owned and/or occupied by him free from all snow, ice, filth and/or other obstructions for a period of 24 consecutive hours or more, then the City Manager, or other official or employee appointed by the City shall cause all snow, ice, filth and/or other obstructions to be removed therefrom, and the cost and expense thereof shall be assessed to the person or persons who shall have refused or neglected so to do, and such cost and expense shall be charged and assessed against such lot and/or premises.
4. It shall be the duty of the City Manager to make a complete report to the Council when any snow, ice, filth and/or other obstructions have been removed from any sidewalk by or at the expense of the City and the proportionate cost and expense to be charged to each lot or premises.

- 5. The Council shall, by resolution, appoint a time at which it will make assessment and/or assessments for the removal of any snow, ice, filth and/or other obstructions from sidewalks or parts of sidewalks within the City and shall cause notice of the time it will act thereon to be given by first class mail to the owner and/or owners of all property to be assessed as shown by the current tax roll of the City, such notice to be posted at least 10 days prior to the time appointed for such hearing.
- 6. At the time appointed for acting on the assessments above set forth, or at such subsequent time to which said action may be adjourned, the Council shall proceed by resolution to assess the lot, lots and/or premises adjacent to and abutting which the sidewalks shall have been cleared of snow, ice, filth and/or other obstructions with the proper cost and expense thereof, and the adoption of such resolution shall be the equivalent of, constitute and be construed as a confirmation of a special assessment roll.
- 7. Upon confirmation of such special assessment roll in the manner above set forth, the special assessments shall become a debt due the City from the persons to whom they are assessed to be due and payable at such time as the Council, by resolution prescribe and shall until paid, be a lien upon the property assessed for the amount of such assessment and all interest and charges thereon, and the Council shall order the assessor to spread the amount thereof upon the special assessment roll as a special assessment upon such lot or premises. Such lien shall be of the same character and effect as provided by the Charter of the City for City taxes and shall be collected in the same manner as other City taxes.
- 8. The City may collect the amount of any assessment determined as aforesaid together with all interest charges and fees due thereon, plus cost of suit in an action of assumpsit against the owner, owners and/or tenants, lessees and/or occupants of any lot or premises to which such assessment applies.
- 9. Failure to mail any notice required to be sent by this ordinance shall not invalidate any assessment made hereunder or any assessment roll.
- 10. If any provision, section, clause or phrase or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be found to be invalid by any court, such invalidity shall not affect any remaining portion or application of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application, provided such remaining portions or applications are not determined by the Court to be inoperable and to this end, this ordinance is hereby declared to be severable.
- 11. This ordinance shall become effective December 14, 1951.

Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Miller and supported by Conroy that a Special Meeting be held December 3, 1951, at 5:00 P.M. to adopt Ordinance C-26-51 relating to the construction, rebuilding and repair of sidewalks and cross-walks in the City of Farmington and Ordinance C-27-51 relating to the cleaning of sidewalks in the City of Farmington. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Miller and supported by Conroy that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, automotive traffic on the perimeter of Detroit involving the Southern parts of Livingston, Oakland and Macomb Counties has become a problem with which the communities involved are financially unable to cope and

WHEREAS, the Eight Mile or Base Line Road (M 102) is taxed to its utmost by existing traffic and

WHEREAS, there are no other main thoroughfares East and West over which heavy traffic volumes may properly move


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Council of the City of Farmington does hereby request the State Highway Commissioner to make the necessary surveys to determine the possibility and the practicability of assuming control of the Ten Mile Road as a State Highway Trunk Line from M 36 at its junction with U. S. 23 to Lake St. Clair.
