# FARMINGTON CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING NOVEMBER 14, 2011

A special meeting of the Farmington City Council was held on Monday, November 14, 2011, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 267-1976.

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mayor Buck.

**PRESENT:** Buck, Cowley, Galvin, Kuiken, McShane, Wright.

**ABSENT:** None.

**CITY ADMINISTRATION:** City Clerk Halberstadt, City Manager Pastue.

City Clerk Halberstadt administered the oath of office to Greg Cowley, Kristin Kuiken and JoAnne McShane.

Councilmembers thanked voters for their support and offered additional comments.

## **ELECTION OF MAYOR**

City Manager Pastue invited councilmembers to express their interest in serving as Mayor or Mayor Pro Tem.

Buck expressed a willingness to continue serving as Mayor if it was the will of the Council.

Discussion followed regarding the responsibilities and expectations of Mayor Pro Tem.

Galvin expressed a willingness to serve as Mayor Pro Tem.

McShane stated she gave strong consideration in requesting a nomination to serve as Mayor, but decided against it for a number of reasons. She noted Tom Buck has done an outstanding job as Mayor and has goals he would yet like to achieve. She believed it would be good for the Council and the City for Buck to continue to serve as Mayor. She noted they have worked really well together and have been through some critical times. She would like to assist him in reaching both his goals along with her own. As a result, she is seeking the office of Mayor Pro Tem. She stated her service is about the betterment of Farmington and she will work hard for the City no matter what position she serves in.

City Manager Pastue opened the floor for nominations for Office of Mayor.

McShane nominated Tom Buck to the Office of Mayor, supported by Galvin.

Hearing no further nominations, Pastue requested a motion to close the nominations and re-elect Tom Buck as Mayor.

<u>11-11-190</u> MOTION by Galvin, seconded by McShane, to close the nominations and re-elect Tom Buck to the Office of Mayor. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Pastue turned the meeting over to Mayor Buck.

## **ELECTION OF MAYOR PRO TEM**

Mayor Buck nominated JoAnne McShane for Office of Mayor Pro Tem, supported by Galvin.

Councilmember Kuiken nominated Bill Galvin for said office.

Hearing no further nominations, Mayor Buck asked for a roll call vote. The vote was as follows:

By majority vote, Bill Galvin was elected Mayor Pro Tem.

Galvin expressed appreciation to Council for their support.

#### **DISCUSSION – 2012 CITY COUNCIL MEETING DATES**

Council discussed proposed Monday or Tuesday meeting schedules for 2012. By majority consensus, Council supported a 2012 Monday meeting schedule.

## ORIENTATION PROCESS FOR NEW CITIY COUNCILMEMBERS

Pastue reviewed the orientation process administration will follow in acclimating new Councilmembers to the structure, finance and operations of the City.

# DISCUSSION – CONSIDERATION TO SCHEDULE A STRATEGIC PLANNING AND GOAL SETTING SESSION(S) FOR EARLY JANUARY

Council agreed to meet on a Saturday in January for a strategic planning and goal setting session. City Manager's office will send out possible meeting dates to Council.

Cowley requested notes from the last Strategic Planning session. Pastue agreed to provide the notes and related work plan to new Councilmembers.

## PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comment was heard.

## COUNCIL COMMENT

McShane thanked City Clerk Halberstadt and her staff for a great job on the City election.

Galvin requested that all City Boards and Commissions provide an annual update to Council.

Pastue advised such annual updates were provided until the recent past and he will make sure they are brought back.

Galvin noted approval for the 2012 Community Development Block Grant is scheduled for the next meeting. He further noted that in his review of previous meeting minutes concerns were expressed by Council regarding this grant. He asked if City Manager Pastue could provide an update on this issue.

Pastue acknowledged the concerns and agreed to provide Council with a written update on the issue by mid-week.

# COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS -4-November 14, 2011

Kuiken noted the CDBG funds are historically applied to senior services. She asked if there is data concerning the use of these services by Farmington residents.

Pastue responded he would provide what data is available to Council.

Kuiken thanked the voters of Farmington for their support. She looked forward to serving with her fellow Councilmembers.

Cowley advised the Downtown Development Authority Board and the Council need to get in lockstep in terms of planning and strategy. He stated one example of long range strategy would be the creation of a Parking Authority. He believes solving some of the City's parking issues is crucial to growth.

Cowley discussed the importance of including the DDA Board in goal setting sessions. He is looking to drive some larger picture agendas. He is seeking guidance on how this can be done.

Cowley thanked the voters for their support. He is looking forward to the opportunity to "sell" Farmington and improve the quality of life for residents.

Buck expressed enthusiasm for serving with the new Council, including McShane who brings a wealth of experience. He offered his assistance to new councilmembers. He recognized the high turnout of voters in the recent City election which demonstrates the engagement of Farmington residents. He noted residents have invested a great deal of responsibility in Council.
