#### **Requested Action:**

Move to hold public hearing on Monday, June 20 at 7:00 p.m. regarding the proposed Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget and property tax rates.

#### **Background:**

In accordance with the City Charter, Public Act 43 of the Extra Session of 1963 and Public Act 2 of 1968 as amended, it is necessary to hold a public hearing on the proposed budget and millage rate prior to their adoption. In accordance with the City Charter, the City Council must adopt the budget prior to June 21. It is recommended that the public hearing be held on Monday, June 20 at 7:00 p.m. Following the public hearing, it is recommended that the City Council adopt the budget and millage rates.

Attached is the proposed public hearing notice. The proposed overall millage rate is 15 mills with 14 mills for operating purposes and one mill for roads. The City Council has the discretion to lower the millage rate once the notice has been published but cannot increase it without holding another public hearing. The City Council can still make changes before the budget is adopted.

The City Council of the City of Farmington will hold a public hearing on the proposed Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget at 7:00 p.m. on June 20, 2016, in the Council Chamber in City Hall, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan 48335.

## THE PROPERTY TAX MILLAGE RATE PROPOSED TO BE LEVIED TO SUPPORT THE PROPOSED BUDGET WILL BE A SUBJECT OF THIS HEARING.

The 2016 proposed property tax levy includes 14.0000 mills (\$14.0000 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value) for city operations and 1.0000 mills (\$1.0000 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value) for road improvements; for a total millage rate of 15.0000 (\$15.0000 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value.)

Public comments, oral or written, are welcome at the hearing on the proposed budget and proposed property tax rate.

The proposed budget, as summarized below, will be on file in the office of the City Manager for public inspection and is also posted in detail on the City's website at www.farmgov.com.

#### **Background:**

The City received a request from Mr. Ed Anderson to conduct their annual road race that would begin and end at Shiawassee Park. This is a fund raising event for the Special Olympics of Oakland County and will be the seventh year that it is held in Shiawassee Park. The event is scheduled to have a one mile, 5K, and 10K route. It is scheduled to begin at 6:30 a.m. Saturday, August 20, 2016 and conclude by 10:30 a.m. The route is the same as in previous years. Most of the route is in Farmington Hills but will have an area that starts and ends within the City of Farmington.

As in the past, the Public Safety Department will have two officers on overtime work with event organizers to assist with route and road crossings.


