FARMINGTON PLANNING COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS 23600 Liberty Street Farmington, Michigan June 9, 2025

Chairperson Perrot called the meeting to order in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan, at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, June 9, 2025.

MOTION by Kmetzo, seconded by Crutcher, to approve the items on the Consent Agenda.

APPROVAL OF ITEMS ON REGULAR AGENDA

Motion by Majoros, supported by Crutcher, to modify the agenda and approve it with the following changes: Under Item No. 5, New Business, that the proposed outdoor seating for Blueberry Brunch be moved from Item No. 5(A) to 5(C), that Item 5(B), Sante, be moved up to the 5(A) position, and the current concept plan be moved from Item 5(C) to 5(B).

MOTION carried, all ayes.

NEW BUSINESS

A. <u>SITE PLAN REVIEW - PROPOSED OUTDOOR SEATING,</u>

SANTE, 33314 GRAND RIVER AVENUE

Chairperson Perrott introduced this item and called the Petitioner to the podium.

Casey Fetzer, co-owner of Sante, a wine tasting room soon to open in downtown Farmington on Grand River on the previous Brown Dog property. We are here today seeking approval from the Commission for an outdoor seating area. This is to be utilized in the same manner as the previous owners were utilizing the seating in the area. We are proposing four tables with eight chairs. This is an exampled of what the area looks like, shared with neighbors Basement Burger Bar in the same manner again as it was shared by the previous owners. And this is an example of the table and chairs we are seeking to purchase which we believe do fit well with the look and feel of the downtown area already. With that, that is all I have to present but I'm happy to take any questions.

Perrott thanked the Petitioner and opened the floor for questions from the Commissioners.

Crutcher asked if the seating arrangement is identical to what it was before and Fetzer replied that the arrangement is the same as well as the number.

MOTION by Majoros, seconded by Crutcher, to approve outdoor seating for Sante, located at 33314 Grand River, for the proposed outdoor seating proposal because the plans meet the standards of Section 35-102(b) of the Zoning Ordinance, Central Business District, contingent upon proof of insurance naming the City as an additional insured in a form and amount deemed acceptable by the City Attorney's office, a license agreement in a form deemed acceptable by the City Attorney's office and MDOT's approved outdoor seating permit.

Motion carried, all ayes.

B. CONCEPT PLAN REVIEW - ART PARK PROMENADE

Claire Perko, Chair of the Design Committee and on the DDA Board, came to the podium. She stated this connects the new Hillside Townes to Riley Park, the two houses that were on the property have been demolished and is being staged for construction and what they're proposing is the new Promenade Art Park that connects these two pivotal areas. She presented a rendering of the proposed plans and stated it be including chalk art, with kids' games, turf grass, plantings. She went through the graphics on the screen and stated that they would be repurposing picnic tables from Memorial Park, re-using the boulders that were on the corner of Grand River and Farmington. There will be lighting, there will be paving, there will be trash receptacles, it will be a park setting with trees and plantings. There is open lawn for playing, artificial turf, room for tents for festivals, there will be power and water.

Chairperson Perrot asked if there were going to be removable bollards as depicted in one of the graphics that could be moved if you needed to bring vehicles down there to load and unload and Perko replied that there are cost restraints involved in paving and the ground cannot handle the weight of a full-sized vehicle but that doesn't mean that we can't put up tents and have power. He then opened the floor for comments and/or questions from the Commission.

MOTION by Majoros, seconded by Crutcher, to approve the Concept Plan for the Art Park Promenade located at 33104 Grand River and 33107 Thomas Street, because the location, character and extent of the improvements are consistent with the requirements of the Hillside Townes Planned Unit Development approval and PUD Agreement and with the City's Master Plan for the Downtown Area. Motion carried, all ayes.

C. <u>SITE PLAN REVIEW – PROPOSED OUTDOOR SEATING,</u> <u>BLUEBERRY BRUNCH, 23336 FARMINGTON ROAD</u>

Chairperson Perrot called the Petitioner to the podium.

Anton Zima, owner, came to the podium. He stated they are looking open up, expand the patio a little bit.

Perrot asked for an overview of the project, stating from his understanding there's seating in the front, there's seating on the side of Grove Street, so walk us through the space and what you have proposed for tonight.

Zima stated we are proposing to add four tables to the front facing the park if you will, the downtown area, to have a little bit of a better view, obviously extend the seating a little bit, get people a little more comfortable. As far as the rest, we already have these ones that are approved for on the side facing Groves Street and eventually we would like to be part of the Syndicate, adding alcohol, all that good stuff.

Perrot opened the floor for questions from the Commissioners.

Majoros asked if there is existing fencing there or is fencing getting added to kind of cordon off the seating from the sidewalk and Zima replied adding, yes.

Crutcher asked for a sample of the fencing and Zima replied it is the black fencing that they have behind Mimosa, it will be fixed, very plain black fencing.

Perrot stated like a permanent metal connected to the columns that support the canopies and Zima replied yes.

Majoros asked if there is existing fencing there or is fencing getting added to kind of cordon off the seating from the sidewalk and Zima replied adding, yes.

Crutcher asked if the tables and chairs will be similar to the ones you have on side and Zima replied they should be exact same.

Majoros asked staff from where the proposed fencing location is, the Applicants meeting all with the sidewalk to make sure there is ability to move forward and there's also outdoor seating at the Mexican restaurant, but are we aligned with sidewalk width separation, from where the fence is to where the sidewalk is, I assume that we're good there and Weber replied we did make sure there was 5 feet side clearance.

Westendorf asked if the trash can will be moved to accommodate the additional seating and Crutcher replied it's not in their seating area, it's on the other side of the columns and the Petitioner stated it's already been moved because of the bee problem so they moved it all the way to the corner.

Building Official Jeff Bowdell stated I can respond to that. This particular business, different Maza is table service, nobody cleaning the tables, the trash can is the Center's responsibility, not theirs. Maza, who is under the old set of rules will eventually be notified and as a group all of those, a few of those businesses that have tables and chairs, we're going to bring them to you as a group so they have the same approval spots as the people with the permanent seating which we've done in the past. Naturally, the side was approved previously and stayed with the restaurant, the front is new and that's why they're in front of you.

Majoros asked if the chairs were plastic or metal and the Petitioner replied they are faux marble, the tables are metal with the faux marble look.

Perrot explained to the Petitioner that oftentimes the Commission is provided with samples of the products intended to be used to make sure they're consistent with the other businesses and quality-wise.

Zima said if he was going to change it over he liked the Spruce & Ash feel and look but right now he is seeking approval and they can move on from there.

Crutcher indicated that the owner of Spruce & Ash made them.

Kmetzo asked if there is going to be a waiting area, with the sitting area going in now, where are people expected to wait for their seats and the Petitioner replied they are going to see how it goes, that perhaps they can utilize a space on the side, but people have been good about waiting, going to TJ Maxx while they wait, but there is honestly no space to it. Kmetzo stated without the additional seating there is an area but it is good for businesses in the downtown area.

MOTION by Majoros, supported by Kmetzo, to approve the outdoor seating for Blueberry Brunch located at 23336 Farmington Road, that the plans as submitted meet the standards of Section 35-102 (b) of the Zoning Ordinance of the Central Business District.

Majoros asked if there is existing fencing there or is fencing getting added to kind of cordon off the seating from the sidewalk and Zima replied adding, yes.
