REPORTS FROM CITY MANAGER

CONSIDERATION TO ADOPT THE FARMINGTON/FARMINGTON HILLS
CULTURAL ARTS MASTER PLAN. Administration advised that the City of Farmington is represented by the cultural arts division operated by the City of Farmington Hills through the City's agreements for services with the City of Farmington Hills. As a result of extensive research through surveys, focus groups and a public hearing, a Cultural Arts Master Plan was developed. The purpose of this Plan is to help guide the new cultural arts division in fulfilling both Cities' desire to make ultimate use of the area's existing resources and to satisfy other cultural needs of the communities.

Nancy Coumoundouros, Cultural Arts Coordinator, was present to support this Plan.

Council suggested the possibility of a televised roundtable discussion between both city mayors and Ms. Coumoundouros to promote awareness of the Plan.

<u>01-01-332</u> MOTION by Bush, seconded by Campbell, to adopt the Farmington/Farmington Hills Cultural Arts Master Plan for use in coordination with the City Master Plan as is appropriate. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS –3-January 3, 2001

CONSIDERATION OF CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT SIDEWALK DISPLAYS AND SIGNAGE. Administration advised that the Downtown Farmington Business Association(DFBA), supported by the Downtown Development Authority, has requested the use of outdoor displays and signage on sidewalks on Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, on a 26-week trial basis. This would require the Council to grant variances to the City's sign ordinance, Section 25-10 Decorative Displays and section 25-13 Prohibited Signs, Subsection 11.

Discussion followed concerning reasons for the request and members of the DFBA indicated the outdoor signage and displays would substantially increase sales enabling them to better compete with larger shopping areas. Council expressed concern regarding the proposed guidelines for displays and signage and the criteria that would be used to determine success. Council requested that the DFBA consult with other communities where outdoor signage and displays are allowed and review their guidelines so that a more definitive set of criteria can be developed. Council also praised the DFBA for their active involvement and encouraged them to use other advertising resources, including cable T.V. and the internet.

<u>01-01-333</u> MOTION by Mitchell, seconded by Bush, to table the decision to grant the Downtown Farmington Business Association the use of outdoor displays and signage on sidewalks on Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays on a 26-week trial basis. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

STATE MAINTENANCE CONTRACT PERMIT RESOLUTION. The State of Michigan requested that the City, by resolution, indemnify the State from any liability which is created by the City's workforce in the State trunkline right-of-way.

<u>01-01-334</u> MOTION by Campbell, seconded by McShane, to adopt a resolution to indemnify the State of Michigan from liability created by City activities on the State trunkline right-of-way and to authorize the City Manager or Director of Public Services to make application for annual permits for the installation of banners and for work on State highways. COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS –4-January 3, 2001

CONSIDERATION OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS PERMIT AGREEMENT WITH MCI METRO ACCESS TRANSMISSION SERVICES, L.L.C. Administration advised that MCI Metro Access Transmission Services, LLC, is constructing a commercial fiber optic telecommunications system in the Farmington/Farmington Hills area and is required to obtain a permit agreement to occupy the public right-of-way for the installation of fiber optic cables. The charge per lineal foot as outlined in the agreement is the same in all telecommunications permits recently issued by the City and is consistent with local standards.

Council asked if this system is strictly for commercial use. City Attorney Donohue responded no, but stated that commercial use is their main market. Council questioned whether there are connectors to other cities and City Manager Lauhoff responded that the fiber optic system loops in and out of the Farmington/Farmington Hills area.

<u>01-01-335</u> MOTION by McShane, seconded by Mitchell, to issue a telecommunications permit to MCI Metro Access Transmission Services, a Delaware limited liability company, located at 2250 Lakeside Blvd., Richardson, Texas for the installation of fiber optic cables within the City of Farmington with the provision for payment based on ten cents (\$.10) per aerial lineal foot and twenty-five cents (\$.25) per underground lineal foot; rates will be indexed for inflation beginning in January 2004; and authorize the City Manager and City Clerk sign the agreement on behalf of the City.
